

INTERESTING PROGRAM FEATURES HALLING LAG SESSION COMING WEEK

**Norwegian Society To Hold
Meeting At Lake Pavilion
June 25th, 26th, and 27th.**

LANDINGS LAG THIS WEEK

**Sessions Are Being Held Today
And Friday—Large Number
Expected.**

The annual convention of the Hallingdal laget will be held at the lake pavilion next week, Thursday, Friday and Saturday. It is expected that there will be between 500 to 1000 in attendance at the meeting of this society, which has a large membership in this section of the country.

The sessions will open on Thursday morning at ten o'clock with A. E. Tufte, York, N. D., president of the society, presiding. Following a short talk by the president, the secretary's report will be read and various committees named. The morning session will close with the rendition of national "Hardanger" music.

The afternoon session will open at two o'clock with music and song, followed by the address of welcome by Mayor A. C. Knudson, closing with a business session. The evening meeting will be featured by a lecture given by Bjergulf Bjornaraa, Trail, Minn., with a number of other talks given. National music will be played by specialists on the "Hardanger" violin.

The Friday morning session will be taken up mainly with reports of committees and other business with election of officers at the opening of the afternoon meeting. The afternoon session will be featured with the execution of the "Springdans," the rendition of Halling music, closing with the showing of a film, "100 Years in Our Western Homes." The main feature of the evening meeting will be a talk by Congressman Burtness of North Dakota, who will speak on his trip to Iceland and Norway in 1930, where he visited as the representative from the United States government.

The convention will close Saturday afternoon with the completion of unfinished business, followed by singing, story telling, and the dancing of the "Spring dans."

The local committee in charge of arrangements is H. Langset, A. C. Knudson, I. K. Grimsgaard, and Andrew Sagadalen.

Landing Laget Here Today

The Landings laget opened their convention here this morning with the registration of visitors. The afternoon program opens with a band concert, by the Detroit Lakes band. A. N. Steen, Northfield, is president of the organization and will preside at the meetings.

This evening, there will be a musical and story-telling contest. Contestants will compete in violin, accordion, humorous readings and stories, and prizes will be awarded to the winners.

The sessions Friday morning and afternoon will be taken up mainly with business with possibly a short program in the afternoon. The evening meeting will be held at the dining room of the First Lutheran church, and will start with a six o'clock dinner. Prof. Sween, State Teachers College, Mayville, N. Dak., will be the principal speaker.

The local committee in charge of arrangements is Gust Sveen and Ole Goplen, both of Audubon. It is expected that there will be between 200 and 300 in attendance at the convention.
